Zhenyuan Wang

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Professor Zhenyuan Wang graduated from Department of Mathematics, Fudan University in 1962. He received his Ph.D. from the Department of Systems Science, State University of New York at Binghamton in 1991. He taught various mathematical courses in Hebei University for many years since 1962, supervised graduate students from 1978, and served as the Chair of the Mathematics Department there from 1985 to 1990. He was a visiting scholar, visiting professor, or research fellow in University Paris VI, Binghamton University (SUNY), Chinese University of Hong Kong, New Mexico State University, and University of Texas at El Paso during the period from 1979 to 2009. Currently, he is a tenured full professor in the Department of Mathematics, University of Nebraska at Omaha. He received a number of honors and awards including the title of “*National expert*” from the Chinese National Scientific and Technological Commission in 1986 and the “*Citation Classic Award*” from the Institute for Scientific Information (USA) in 2000. His research interests are nonadditive measures, nonlinear integrals, probability and statistics, optimization, soft computing, and data science. He is the author or a co-author of more than 160 research papers and three monographs: “*Fuzzy Measure Theory*” (1992), “*Generalized Measure Theory*” (2008), and “*Nonlinear Integrals and Their Applications in Data Mining*” (2010). He is currently serving as a member of Editorial Board for international journals such as *Fuzzy Sets and Systems*.
